ENROLMENT, INVITATION TO THE COMPETITION & INFORMATION

Dear all,

On behalf of FEIF and DI we hereby welcome you all to the 9th FEIF YouthCup (FYCup)!

Please find below and enclosed all the necessary information and forms needed for participation and visiting the FYCup 2010 at Kalö Agricultural College.

The FYCup will be organized following the rules of FIPO and FIRO edition 6.10/2010 All tests of the FYCup are presented in the FIPO and all rules can be downloaded from the website www.feif.org.

Please note also that all participating horses (including rented horses) have to be registered in WorldFengur. This means also that a valid FEIF Id number is required for every horse! The data on the horses' registration paper will be checked against the data in WorldFengur. All horses should be vaccinated properly (see below). Please be sure to check the vaccination papers in due time.

The **deadlines** for the entries must be taken seriously. Countries which do not send in their forms at the right date, must reckon that their places will be given to other countries (more specific information about the forms are found below).

Entries: form 2, 3, 4, 5, 6 **latest:** 10th June 2010

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1. General information

For the opening and closing ceremonies we kindly ask the participating nations to bring their flags with them, one to carry and one for the flagpole.

We also ask the accompanying adult (hereinafter called the country leader) to prepare, with their national team, one presentation of their country (max. 15 min. per country) to be presented on the Tuesday evening. The aim for this nation's evening is to help the participants to get to know each other and the different countries represented on the FY-Cup and hopefully this will be a fun evening for all participants (and leaders)!

It is welcomed to bring music instruments with you for the social evenings!

Please note that the FY-Cup is an alcohol and smoke free event. There will be designated areas at the place where smoking is possible. However, as all participants are under age they are required to bring a written permission from their parents if they shall be allowed to smoke.

Forms 5 & 6 should first state all about the participants (name, address, age etc.) and then all information about the horses. The name, address and e-mail address of the CL (and of TL and judge if the country sends those) should also be added.

*Please note that the applications for the participants (form 2) and for the horses (form 3) have to be filled out and signed by **parents and participant**. By signing the forms the participants and parents agree to follow the rules as stated in this invitation or documents referred to in this invitation.*

All forms (typed and signed) have to be sent to **the following address** in Austria:

The sending in of the pre-entries is necessary to find out the approximate total of participants. Countries with more than the given number of participants should also send in their "waiting list" together with the pre-entry form. Free places will be given out by the FEIF Youth office.

3. Eligible riders

Eligible riders are all youngsters who will TURN 14, 15, 16 or 17 years of age in the year of the FYCup. A proof of age is required; a copy of valid ID, such as a passport or similar, is to be sent in with form 2.

4. Vaccinations

Please note that the FYCup is an international competition, i.e. all participating horses (also rented horses) have to be vaccinated according to the FEIF rules (see the FEIF home page, www.feif.org, for further information). No protection by vaccination is required for horses which are directly imported from Iceland and come directly to Kalö. All other horses that are not correctly inoculated will not be allowed to participate. Please observe carefully the regulations of the host country.

5. Insurance

Please keep in mind that all participants have to have a valid accident insurance for the event. Please provide proof of the insurance with the registration of the participants.

Attention:

- Following the decision taken at the Delegates Assembly 2005, the V3 and F3 are replaced by V2 and F2 at the FYCup 2010.
- Please be aware of the changes in FIPO valid from 1st of April 2010.

Rules: Valid rules are FIPO and FIRO edition 6.10/2010 and the camp rules. If there are differences between the German and English version, the English prevails.

The entries for the tests of the tournament will be done on the Tuesday evening by the team leader (TL).



6. Miscellaneous information

- CL:** It is very important that the CL speaks English, is able to work in a team and has the ability to assert oneself. The main task for the CL is to be responsible for their own country's youths, the connection to the parents as well as the connection to the organization and FEIF. Furthermore the CL is responsible for the welfare of the horses of their own country (health, keeping, food, and tidiness in the stable area). The CL is responsible for bringing its country's trophies and flags to the FYCup. The CL is also expected to do some work in the organization (organizes one evening and works as judge secretaries during the competition). The CL is responsible for the travelling to and from the FYCup of its participants and horses, is also expected to know its participants riding abilities and is responsible for equipment (competition (FIPO) rules!), and taking part in the CL meetings, (preferably a person with no nerves, flexible and dynamic!) The CL sleeps together with his/her country's team and is responsible for the quietness during the nights. The CL is to inform the parents about the "non parent rule" (see below) of the FYCup. It's the responsibility of the CL to decide upon, after consulting the FYCup trainer and participant in question, whether and if so what kind of training the horse needs on the Wednesday. The CL is responsible for its participants being well informed in advance about the ideas, reasons and senses of the FYCup as well as the importance of the international spirit.
- TL:** The TL speaks English fluently, has experience in competitions, and has good organizing skills. The main task of the TL is to be a dedicated team leader for its team, meaning that he/she is responsible for making a good team spirit within the team, follow the team to its trainings, daily eat meals together with the team, takes part in the team test. Furthermore it's the task of the TL to work out the entries for the team (together with the team), he/she knows the FYC rules, checks equipment, stands in for the riders/horses of the team and takes part in the TL meetings.
- Teams:** The FEIF Youth leader builds the international teams; they will be announced on Saturday evening. Each team gets a team leader (TL) - they will be drawn by lot at the meeting.
- Reason and sense of the teams:** Understanding across borders, to help each other, accept different opinions, as well as getting friends across the borders. The teams will also be responsible for tasks within the organization; they are together in the team test and will be evaluated in the team competition.
- Judges:** Judges are either announced by their countries or invited by FEIF/OC. Judges meeting is Thursday morning. They should be experienced with youth test and rules and be international FEIF sport judges. They have free meals and lodging, their travelling costs are paid by FEIF via an extra fee of /participant which the country sending the youth pays to FEIF (as decided on the annual youth leader meeting 2007). The reason for this "fee" is to evenly split the costs of the judges between the participating countries instead of letting just some countries pay for it.
- Training:** All participants will be trained by the acclaimed riding instructors. These instructors are qualified and experienced in schooling rider and horse. It is expected that the participants take part in the total program of the event.



Horses: All horses have to be shod according to FIPO rules, which also include rented/borrowed horses. All horses need an official Horse Registration passport (for the EU: Equidenpass) or similar in other countries. The horses have to be registered in WorldFengur and have a valid FEIF ID number. The data on the horses' registration papers will be checked against the data in WorldFengur. All horses have to be vaccinated in accordance with the FEIF rules for international competitions.

7. Stables

The host country provides one big paddock for each country; the counties are responsible for dividing the big paddock into smaller paddocks as they like, remember to bring your own fencing material. Do not forget something to put water in and all extra feeding you need for your horse. As you have to clean the paddock you will need some equipment for that. Please mention in your registration form No 3 (horse registration) if your horse is allergic to hay and needs hay silage and if you are bringing a stallion.

The rent of the boxes is **95 €** per box and week and is together with the participant fee to the FEIF office no later than on the 12th of June. It is also possible for the countries to rent a box to have their riding tack in throughout the week. Otherwise the riding tack has to be in your horse wagon.

8. Accommodation & payment

Lodging of riders and official accompanying adults: at the place.

Costs: the costs for the participants are **550 €** CL and others (officials) pay **260 €**

This includes lodging and all meals.

Lodging of participants/trainer/CL/TL, other officials: participants are sleeping in the school's classrooms together with their CL. NB its mandatory for the CL to sleep in the same arrangements as the participants. **TL's** are to stay in a nearby separate house, trainers & judges are lodged in a nearby house. Participants, TL and CL have to bring sleeping bags and pillows.

The countries who had participants winning trophies in the last FYCup in Brunnadern are kindly asked to take care that these trophies will be at Kalö no later than on the 10th of July 2010 (only challenge trophies). Team test and team combination have no challenge trophy (they are given out to the winner to keep). Together with the “big” trophy, a miniature copy is given out to the winner who can keep this miniature. Each country has to present a new miniature at the FYC. The miniature has to be at Kalö no later than 13th July. Exceptions to this are the prizes for the team combination (N) and the team test (FEIF), which are given out at each FYC. If the country fails to deliver the trophies/miniatures in due time, the country will have to pay a fine, as agreed on the annual youth leader meeting 2007.
